CONTEXT AND EXPECTED OUTPUTS



SupMed is a development project funded by the French Facility for Global Environment (FFEM). It aims to co-design and implement climate change adaptation strategies in Egypt and Lebanon.

Several strategies based on the promotion and implementation of agroecological practices have been put forward and field-tested in the Beqaa region in Lebanon and the Luxor governorate in Egypt. These strategies have been extensively discussed with local and national stakeholders and policymakers in order to study their application on a wider scale than the initial intervention areas. It is in this context that we wish to share the results of the project with other Mediterranean countries than Egypt and Lebanon. Five main outputs are expected:

Output 1 - discusses the extent to which the SupMed experience may be applied to contexts other than in Egypt and Lebanon. The term experience in this case refers to two important aspects: the methods used for co-designing strategies that are technically efficient, economically profitable and socially acceptable, and the key factors for considering the results of these strategies in future policies.

Output 2 - provides an opportunity for NGOs leading initiatives and projects in MENA region and Greece to share their experiences regarding the promotion of agroecological practices. The event will allow the comparing of lessons learned from these experiences and discussing the limits and advantages of promoting and adopting such strategies.

Output 3 - discusses, collectively (with NGOs, researchers, policy makers, and others), the key arguments and messages to be addressed to donors, policy makers, educational and research institutions and even professional agencies, with aims to encourage such stakeholders to invest in agroecology as a dominant production model where relevant. This discussion should serve to ultimately establish a common advocacy letter, to be signed by all participants with their consent, along with a roadmap for its dissemination. The CIHEAM-IAMM, as a leading actor in the Mediterranean, will take charge of disseminating this letter.



Output 4 - having this event serve as an opportunity for at least 12 farmer associations and 6 to 10 traders and exporters to meet and negotiate specific commercial contracts, therefore facilitating access to market.

Output 5 - arriving to have the three Ministers of Agriculture of Egypt, Lebanon and Greece make a common statement declaring the promotion of agroecology in their corresponding ministries and to explicitly subscribe agroecology as a priority for future policies.


